


#### Here is Maellyn from South Africa. Put the paragraphs into the right order to discover her story.

- a) I traveled as much as I could on my waitressing wages and even lived in Australia for a year. I still wasn't sure what I wanted to do and tried fashion styling and did some work experience at fashion magazines, but none of this was very exciting.
- b) For a short time, we moved to Wales and ended up living in an old, abandoned Dukes' castle. This was the first time I ever saw snow, and it was a surreal experience.
  - I always dreamed of traveling and seeing as many exotic places as I could. I remember as a teenager cycling to the airport and watching the planes go by, dreaming that one day I would be looking down from one instead of up at it.



- c) After a while, I took a job as a receptionist in a PR (public relations) agency and was quickly promoted to work as a PR executive. The company also paid for me to study journalism while I worked. I spent almost four years in PR, but the corporate world, full of backstabbing and dirty office politics was not what I wanted.
- d) A car accident I got into meant that I had to give up dancing, and I began to waitress to pay the rent and bills. I moved to Cape Town for a year and worked at a cocktail bar overlooking the sea before heading to London.
- e) I slowly taught myself how to use a camera, how to direct and edit videos, while doing various menial temp jobs to pay the rent. At first I did free work, making videos for friends and slowly began to earn money from it.
  - At every opportunity, I took courses in various aspects of film- making. It took about four years to become a full- time freelance filmmaker, and I did many different jobs along the way. I filmed weddings and events and made corporate videos.



- g) I grew up in South Africa during the apartheid years. My parents moved so frequently that by the time I was 18 and it was time for me to leave home, I had lived in at least 38 places.

  I remember as a young child living in remote places surrounded by forests and streams and living in caravans. It was a paradise.

  I know there will be many more adventures, and I am now constantly looking down through the clouds as I fly remembering the days I looked up.
  - i) The older I get, the more interested I am in a way of living that is closer to nature, the way I grew up. I've become interested in the knowledge of indigenous tribes around the world. At the moment, I am filming a series of

documentaries that look at tattooing as part of indigenous culture. There are many reasons, but I'm focusing on the tattoos that are done for healing, some placed on acupuncture points and others with healing plants in the tattoo ink.

- i) I realized that this world had killed my creativity and joy in life, and I left it for good. I did a lot of soul-searching and decided that I wanted to be a filmmaker. This seemed like a huge challenge, as I was almost 30 by this stage, and it is a very competitive career choice.
- k) I have now filmed in many places, and the journey continues. I moved to Dubai at the beginning of 2014 as there were more opportunities there, and the sun shines every day, unlike in the UK. It has been a great adventure, and I am finally able to afford to travel and make the documentaries that I want to. There are so many stories to be told.
